

Laboratory Procedures

Gracillin is supplied as a crystalline solid. A stock solution may be made by dissolving the gracillin in the solvent of choice. Gracillin is soluble in organic solvents such as DMSO and dimethyl formamide, which should be purged with an inert gas. The solubility of gracillin in these solvents is approximately 30 mg/ml.

Description

Gracillin is a steroidal saponin that has been found in C. speciosus and has diverse biological activities. 1-3 lt reduces cell growth in a panel of 58 leukemia, non-small cell lung, colon, CNS, prostate, melanoma, ovarian, renal, and breast cancer cell lines (GI_{50} s = 0.58-2.44 μ M).¹ Gracillin reduces growth of fish Ich parasite (I. multifiliis) theronts ($EC_{50} = 0.53 \text{ mg/L}$) and induces 100 and 92.5% mortality of I. multifiliis protomonts and encysted tomonts, respectively, when used at a concentration of 0.8 mg/L.² It decreases the number of I. multifiliis-infected goldfish by approximately 75% when used at a concentration of 1 mg/L in tank water. Gracillin (100 mg/kg) reduces ear edema induced by arachidonic acid (Item No. 90010) in mice.³
