## **Laboratory Procedures**

KX1-004 is supplied as a crystalline solid. A stock solution may be made by dissolving the KX1-004 in the solvent of choice. KX1-004 is soluble in organic solvents such as ethanol, DMSO, and dimethyl formamide, which should be purged with an inert gas. The solubility of KX1-004 in these solvents is approximately 2.5, 20, and 30 mg/ml, respectively.

## Description

KX1-004 is a non-ATP competitive inhibitor of Src protein tyrosine kinase (Src-PTK;  $IC_{50}$  = 40  $\mu$ M). It protects against a permanent threshold shift in the auditory threshold and against outer hair cell loss in chinchillas following noise exposure at 106 dB when used at 30, 50, or 100 µM on the round window membrane of the ear. KX1-004 (50 mg/kg) is also effective against chronic noise exposure when administered systemically in chinchillas.<sup>2</sup>
