

Laboratory Procedures

Neurokinin B (trifluoroacetate salt) is supplied as a lyophilized powder. A stock solution may be made by dissolving the neurokinin B (trifluoroacetate salt) in the solvent of choice, which should be purged with an inert gas. Neurokinin B (trifluoroacetate salt) is soluble in the organic solvent formic acid at a concentration of approximately 1 mg/ml.

Description

Neurokinin B is a tachykinin peptide agonist of the neurokinin-3 receptor (NK₃; K_i = 0.8 nM).^{1,2} In vitro, neurokinin B dose-dependently induces calcium mobilization in HEK293 cells expressing NK3 (EC₅₀ = 0.5 nM), an effect inhibited by NK₃ antagonists. Neurokinin B potentiates electrically-induced contractions in rat vas deferens and increases vasodilation in rat hind paw in a dose-dependent manner.1 In juvenile male rhesus monkeys, neurokinin B (100 μg, i.v.) stimulates luteinizing hormone (LH) release and acts within the hypothalamus, suggesting a role in initiating puberty.⁴
