#### Laboratory Procedures

 $(\pm)5(6)$ -EET-d<sub>11</sub> methyl ester is intended for use as an internal standard for the quantification of 5(6)-EET methyl ester by GC- or LC-MS. The accuracy of the sample weight in this vial is between 5% over and 2% under the amount shown on the vial. If better precision is required, the deuterated standard should be quantitated against a more precisely weighed unlabeled standard by constructing a standard curve of peak intensity ratios (deuterated versus unlabeled).

 $(\pm)5(6)$ -EET-d<sub>11</sub> methyl ester is supplied as a solution in ethanol. To change the solvent, simply evaporate the ethanol under a gentle stream of nitrogen and immediately add the solvent of choice. Solvents such as DMSO and dimethyl formamide purged with an inert gas can be used. The solubility of  $(\pm)5(6)$ -EET-d<sub>11</sub> methyl ester in these solvents is approximately 50 mg/ml.

#### Description

(±)5(6)-EET methyl ester (Item No. 50210) is an esterified form of (±)5(6)-EET (Item No. 50211). 5(S),6(R)-EET and 5(R),6(S)-EET are formed via epoxidation of arachidonic acid (Item Nos. 90010 | 90010.1 | 10006607) by a variety of cytochrome P450 (CYP) isoforms, including CYP2B1, CYP2B2, CYP2C11, CYP2C23, and CYP2C24.1,2
