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#### Laboratory Procedures

Cefadroxil-d<sub>4</sub> (trifluoroacetate salt) is intended for use as an internal standard for the quantification of cefadroxil (Item No. 20365) by GC- or LC-MS. The accuracy of the sample weight in this vial is between 5% over and 2% under the amount shown on the vial. If better precision is required, the deuterated standard should be quantitated against a more precisely weighed unlabeled standard by constructing a standard curve of peak intensity ratios (deuterated versus unlabeled).

Cefadroxil- $d_{4}$  (trifluoroacetate salt) is supplied as a solid. A stock solution may be made by dissolving the cefadroxil- $d_4$  (trifluoroacetate salt) in the solvent of choice, which should be purged with an inert gas. Cefadroxil- $d_{4}$  (trifluoroacetate salt) is soluble in methanol and DMSO. It is also soluble in water. We do not recommend storing the aqueous solution for more than one day.

#### Description

Cefadroxil is a semisynthetic cephalosporin antibiotic.<sup>1</sup> It is active against a variety of Gram-positive and Gram-negative bacteria, including B. anthracis, V. cholerae, and P. multocida strains (MICs = 1, 2, and 4 µg/ml, respectively), among others. Cefadroxil is protective against infection by strains of S. pyogenes, S. pneumoniae, or S. aureus in mice with 50% protective dose (PD<sub>50</sub>) values of 0.6-2.4, 18-24, and 0.3-29 mg/kg, respectively. Formulations containing cefadroxil have been used in the treatment of a variety of bacterial infections.
