

Laboratory Procedures

Mometasone furoate-d₃ is intended for use as an internal standard for the quantification of mometasone furoate (Item No. 21365) by GC- or LC-MS. The accuracy of the sample weight in this vial is between 5% over and 2% under the amount shown on the vial. If better precision is required, the deuterated standard should be quantitated against a more precisely weighed unlabeled standard by constructing a standard curve of peak intensity ratios (deuterated versus unlabeled).

Mometasone furoate-d₃ is supplied as a solid. A stock solution may be made by dissolving the mometasone furoate-d₂ in the solvent of choice, which should be purged with an inert gas. Mometasone furoate-d₂ is soluble in a 1:1 solution of acetonitrile:methanol.

Description

Mometasone furoate is a prodrug form of the synthetic glucocorticoid mometasone (Item No. 31702).¹ Intranasal administration of mometasone furoate (1 µg/nostril) reduces the frequency of sneezing and nasal rubbing in a rat model of histamine-induced allergic rhinitis.² Topical application of mometasone furoate reduces croton oil-induced ear edema in mice (ED $_{50}$ = 0.31 µg/ml).³ Formulations containing mometasone furoate have been used in the treatment of allergic rhinitis, atopic dermatitis, and asthma.
