Laboratory Procedures

Pregabalin diacid impurity is supplied as a solid. A stock solution may be made by dissolving the pregabalin diacid impurity in the solvent of choice, which should be purged with an inert gas. Pregabalin diacid impurity is soluble in organic solvents such as ethanol, DMSO, and dimethyl formamide. The solubility of pregabalin diacid impurity in these solvents is approximately 30 mg/ml.

Further dilutions of the stock solution into aqueous buffers or isotonic saline should be made prior to performing biological experiments. Ensure that the residual amount of organic solvent is insignificant, since organic solvents may have physiological effects at low concentrations. Organic solvent-free aqueous solutions of pregabalin diacid impurity can be prepared by directly dissolving the solid in aqueous buffers. The solubility of pregabalin diacid impurity in PBS (pH 7.2) is approximately 10 mg/ml. We do not recommend storing the aqueous solution for more than one day.

Description

Pregabalin diacid impurity is a potential impurity found in commercial preparations of pregabalin.¹
