

### **Laboratory Procedures**

(±)9-HETE-d<sub>8</sub> is intended for use as an internal standard for the quantification of (±)9-HETE (Item No. 34400) by GC- or LC-MS. The accuracy of the sample weight in this vial is between 5% over and 2% under the amount shown on the vial. If better precision is required, the deuterated standard should be quantitated against a more precisely weighed unlabeled standard by constructing a standard curve of peak intensity ratios (deuterated versus unlabeled).

(±)9-HETE-d<sub>8</sub> is supplied as a solution in acetonitrile. To change the solvent, simply evaporate the acetonitrile under a gentle stream of nitrogen and immediately add the solvent of choice. Solvents such as ethanol, DMSO, and dimethyl formamide (DMF) purged with an inert gas can be used. The solubility of (±)9-HETE-d<sub>R</sub> in ethanol is approximately 50 mg/ml and approximately 20 mg/ml in DMSO and DMF.

### Description

(±)9-HETE is formed by lipid peroxidation of arachidonic acid (Item Nos. 90010 | 90010.1 | 10006607).1 9(S)-HETE and 9(R)-HETE are formed via oxidation of arachidonic acid by rat liver microsomal cytochrome P450 (CYP) in a non-stereoselective manner.<sup>2</sup>
